Article 38. AMENDMENTS TO ZONING ORDINANCE ARTICLE 8: STREET AND STORM DRAINAGE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS AND RELATED CHANGES. To see if the Town will vote to amend Article 8 of the Zoning Ordinance, and update the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Ordinance and Road Naming and Property Numbering Ordinance in accordance with changes to Article 8. Highlights of proposed changes include:

Zoning Ordinance

- An application and approval process for roads not associated with subdivisions has been added. (Section 8.2)
- The “Private Right-of-Way” category of roads has been deleted and replaced with a “Local” category and associated subcategories, which include “Standard,” “Low Volume,” and “Conservation Density.” Each subcategory has a new set of standards. (Section 8.5.4)
- Standards for “T” and “hammerhead” turnarounds have been provided. Standards are missing from the current zoning ordinance. (Section 8.5.6)
- Sight distance requirements have been revised to meet Maine DOT Chapter 299 standards. (Section 8.5.7)
- Procedures and standards have been provided for the submission of roads to the Selectmen for placement on the Town Meeting warrant. If the Selectmen deny the request and the applicant completes the petition process in accordance with Title 30-A MRSA 2533 the request may still be placed on the Town Meeting warrant. (Section 8.9)
- Driveway has been defined as a vehicle access-way serving three (3) or fewer dwelling units. The definition of “Road” and terms related to the classification of roads have been revised, see full text document. (Section 2.2 & 2.3)

Subdivision Ordinance

- Driveway has been defined as a vehicle access-way serving three (3) or fewer dwelling units. The definition of “Road” and terms related to the classification of roads have been revised, see full text document. (Article 12)
- Subdivision submission requirements have been updated to reflect the revised Article 8. (Articles 6 & 8)

Article 39. AMENDMENTS TO PROVISIONS, RULES, & REGULATIONS RELATING TO ENTRANCE TO TOWN WAYS OR OTHER CHANGES WITHIN TOWN WAYS ORDINANCE AND THE NEW GLOUCESTER ZONING ORDINANCE. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town of New Gloucester Provisions, Rules, & Regulations Relating to Entrance to Town Ways or Other Changes within Town Ways and the New Gloucester Zoning Ordinance. Below is the full text of the proposed revisions:

- Permitting requirements from the stand alone ordinance Provisions, Rules, & Regulations Relating to Entrance to Town Ways have been moved to Section 5.1.34 of the New Gloucester Zoning Ordinance. Ordinance provisions have been expanded to include all entrances and driveways.
- While additional standards regarding intersection angle, maximum driveway grade, and sight distance have been added, they only apply “to the greatest extent practicable.”
- Since the standards have been moved to 5.1.34, the current stand alone ordinance has been struck in its entirety.

- Proposed amendments include format corrections, updating state statute references, correcting errors of omission in Article 4, and primarily non-substantive changes related to ensuring ordinance consistency and accuracy.
- Timing and size of political signs changed to state law Title 23 MRS 1913-A. Intent is to simplify enforcement. (Section 5.1.19.C.12)
